

INTRODUCTION

Bal Ashram Trust is an innovative and transformative grassroots solution which addresses complex and deep-rooted societal problems **to ensure child protection and create a child-friendly world.** It was founded by Nobel Peace Laureate Shri Kailash Satyarthi and Smt. Sumedha Kailash in 1998 as **a long-term rehabilitation centre** for children rescued from child labour, child slavery, and child trafficking.

The Trust also runs programs focusing on child-centric and holistic community development - the Bal Mitra Gram (Child-friendly Villages) and the Banjara (Nomadic) Education Centres.

Through our three programs, we have impacted over 1,74,724 lives.

We follow a **rights-based approach** where we work to inculcate values of justice, equality, and freedom by incorporating principles of democratic participation, accountability, and non-discrimination at every stage of our programs. An example of this is the elected 'Bal Panchayat' (Leadership Council of Children) which provides child leaders equal participation in relevant matters of local governance and a voice to demand change - through dialogue and partnership with the Village Council.

We also create **strong linkages and partnerships with government agencies** at the local, state and the national level to ensure holistic, systemic and sustainable impact.



Our Vision is to create a child-friendly world where all children have access to their rights and can become compassionate, responsible citizens and agents of change.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The onset of the second pandemic wave took a significant toll on people's lives across the nation.

As per a report by the International Labour Organisation (ILO) and UNICEF, "the COVID-19 pandemic will pose very real risk of backtracking" the efforts made to eradicate child labour in the previous years. According to UNESCO, the global average for school closures was recorded to be 37 weeks, while in India schools were closed for 82 weeks (UNESCO, November 2021). The pandemic not only disrupted the education system across the country but also exacerbated the pre-existing vulnerabilities to livelihoods faced by lowincome, rural and migrant families. The rights of all children were, thus, under threat to a degree that has not been seen in more than a generation.

However, in the last year we worked tirelessly with the support of our partners to battle the mounting impact of the pandemic's second wave. During those testing times, we reached out to the most marginalized communities, specifically children and young women, to prevent school dropouts, child marriage, and forced labour. Our team on ground distributed ration kits, sanitizers and protective gears/kits were also actively sensitizing communities on the significance of vaccinations against COVID-19.

The members of our Mahila Mandal (Women's Group), Yuva Mandal (Youth Group), and young leaders from Bal Panchayat were critical in providing support to the marginalized communities during the pandemic. We adapted to the new normal and planned our activities throughout the year accordingly

Over 8700 adults and more than 930 children received their vaccination against COVID-19 through the vaccination camps organized by the local health services in Banjara villages and our BMGsTM.

The overall impact of COVID-19 has been nerve-wracking and has posed a greater risk of mental health problems among the children, youth and adults. We partnered with FORTIS Mental Health Care Services to provide free online counseling for the children at our Bal Ashram-Rehabilitation Centre to help them deal with the pandemic.

Not only did we make efforts to mitigate the challenges, but we also partnered with various renowned entities like UNESCO MGIEP and Adobe during the year. To make our efforts more sustainable, we ensured that people benefitted through linkages with various government schemes.

Along with our efforts to prevent the spread of COVID-19, our team made remarkable difference in the communities of Rajasthan through various awareness campaigns on child marriage and child labour.

As the pandemic situation began to improve, we organized multiple awareness campaigns including **Shehnayi Nahi Padhayi** and **School Chalo Abhiyaan** to educate communities about the repercussions of child marriage and prevent school dropouts. About **30,000** people were reached and were informed about the ills of child marriage, and the need for education. Around **1,05,000** people have been impacted through the BMGTM(Bal Mitra Gram) program.

BALASHRAM - REHABILITATION CENTRE

At Bal Ashram-Rehabilitation Centre, we work with children rescued from child labour, trafficking, abuse, and exploitation. Almost all the children who come to the Ashram have faced some trauma. Therefore, to help them overcome their traumas, our in-house counselors, teachers, and staff at Bal Ashram strive to give them an environment of safety, love, care, and enough space to help them rebuild their self-esteem and confidence.

We also ensure that all children have access to nutrition and health facilities, formal and non-formal education, career counseling for higher education, skill training, digital learning, sports, and co-curricular activities that help them develop their team-building skills, problem-solving skills, and leadership skills.



We are happy to share some of the key updates of the year:

- ◆ 135 children received care and protection at Bal Ashram-Rehabilitation Centre;
- ◆ **72** children continued their formal education in Government school;
- ◆ **33** children attended non-formal education classes at Bal Ashram;
- ◆ 30 children received vocational skill training, including stitching & tailoring, electrical training, and carpentry trade;
- ◆ Children from the age of 6-14 years attended literacy and numeracy classes, alphabets, vowels, and consonants in their Non-Formal Education classes held at Bal Ashram;
- ◆ 15 children appeared for the 10th and 12th board exams this year.



EDUCATION

During the beginning of the year, the regular classes for children from formal education were conducted online at the Ashram. Children were provided smartphones which helped them continue their regular classes.

Bal Ashram campus got equipped with 24*7 Wifi which was crucial for us to ensure that every child studying online gets access to study material and learning tutorials.

Aftercare Support for children above 18 years

We support children in aftercare by exploring career opportunities, creating linkages with the government schemes, providing them with various scholarships, and orienting them about higher education institutions. The overarching goal is to support these children to opt for careers of their interests, which could also increase their chance of employability.



Introducing 21st-century skills for our children at Bal Ashram

We introduced Scratch Coding classes for children in Grades 7 to 9 as part of our digital learning curriculum.

To fuel their interest in learning English, we appointed a full-time English teacher at Bal Ashram to help them with grammar, communication, speech and more. During the year, 112 Children attended English reading and writing classes at Bal Ashram. The teacher planned extra lessons and routine tests and grammar worksheets for children appearing for the board exams.

We were happy to observe that these children became more confident in speaking English, and some of them have even taken the lead by writing scripts in English to anchor programs and events at Bal Ashram.

5 children from Bal Ashram secured admission to SRM Institute of Science and Technology

5 Children from Bal Ashram have enrolled at SRM Institute of Science of Technology, Chennai, to pursue their choice of courses that include hotel & catering, management, physiotherapy, business administration, nursing, and physical and health education. These children were supported by Bal Ashram Trust's After Care facility. Their education expenses are being supported by our partner Kailash Satyarthi Children's Foundation's Freedom Fellows Education Fund.

SKILL TRAINING FOR BOYS AT BAL ASHRAM

At Bal Ashram Rehabilitation Centre, we also have a skill training program for boys over the age of 14 years to motivate and encourage them in exploring their careers in skill-based jobs.

We have three different skill training centres for boys at Bal Ashram.

Stitching & Tailoring Trade

23 Children got enrolled for Stitching & Tailoring Trade. These children were trained in apparel in stitching and tailoring (both Men & Women), buttoning the garments, & learnt about various stitching tools.

Carpentry Trade

3 Children from Bal Ashram made furniture items such as table furniture, benches, window frames, & glass fittings. They have also gained knowledge regarding the essential tools & machinery.

Electrical Trade

4 Children were enrolled in the Electrical trade under which they were taught about air conditioner, washing machines, geysers, & water coolers servicing, repairing ceiling fans & regulators, solar panels, domestic wiring, and fittings.

Skill Training Centre for Girls

Bal Ashram Trust also provides skill training to adolescent girls in the Jaipur and Alwar districts of Rajasthan. The program aims to enhance livelihood opportunities for young girls and promote market-oriented skills that train them to gain remuneration and dignified career options.

These girls learn basic I.T. skills, tailoring, embroidery, and beautician skills. Along with the technical training, we have also introduced a curriculum on issues concerning women and children, including dowry, education, gender equality, etc. A total of **31 women** benefited from these courses.

Some of our students are either victims of child marriage or child labour. Their life stories have motivated us to keep exploring potential partnerships to reach out to a broader group of girls from marginalized societies.



Mental Health & Speech Therapy

We continued to support children's mental well-being by providing online counseling sessions from the team of psychologists from Fortis healthcare. These sessions aim to promote their mental wellbeing.

63 sessions were conducted by the Fortis Mental Health Counseling team, while 7 Children received speech therapy. We have observed an increase in children's self-confidence, class participation, and clarity in their speech as an outcome of these sessions.

Neev Career Counseling Program

A unique program primarily focusing on identifying educational and employability programs for the children, preparing them to identify courses as per their interest, building their capacity, and communication skills, and providing them relevant exposure.

To counsel children at Bal Ashram about various career prospects, we organized multiple career counseling sessions by Mr. Chandra Sawan, a professional career counselor by profession. He conducted and oriented them about various higher education courses. Besides the career counseling sessions, our children also attended alumni sessions with Bal Ashram alumni currently pursuing professional careers. Such sessions motivate the children at Bal Ashram bringing more hope and boosting their self-confidence and morale.

During the reporting period, **5 Career counseling sessions** and **12 alumni sessions** were conducted.





BANJARA EDUCATION CENTRES

INTRODUCTION

Bal Ashram Trust works with the Banjara (nomadic) communities located in the remote villages of Rajasthan. Banjara Education Centres (BEC) are community-based learning centres to provide basic education to children from Banjara communities and address deep-rooted socio-cultural problems through community-based interventions and participative reform.

BACKGROUND

Banjaras are a group of various nomadic tribes found throughout India, and they live in small isolated groups called thandas. These communities typically have high illiteracy rates, low-income levels, and poor infrastructure, they are subjected to extreme discrimination and marginalization by other upper caste communities. The continuous migration due to these factors leads to child labour, child marriage, and a lack of education for the Banjara children.

To halt these exploitative practices, our first Banjara Education Centre was established in 2008. These child-friendly education centres provide a hands-on learning experience to children, especially girls, and support their families through community-based intervention and participative reforms.

Through this program, we aim to address the deep-rooted socio-cultural practices with a focus on female empowerment, create first-generation school learners and enable the community to find an alternative to regular migration leading to societal acceptance without ostracization and discrimination. Currently, we have **13 Banjara Education Centres** located in Rajasthan.

Here are some glimpses of the key activities held at our Banjara Education Centres.

EDUCATION

The COVID-19 pandemic posed a significant threat to the children of Banjara Communities as there were speculations that many families were migrating during and after the second wave.

Despite the closure of schools until September 2021, our teachers ensured the children did not miss out on their studies.

Our teachers went an extra mile and taught children at their doorsteps, maintaining the social-distancing guidelines. They planned a daily timetable, prepared worksheets for children, visited each child's home, discussed the lessons, and guided them throughout. These efforts have been instrumental in providing education to **373** children, of which 209 were girls, and 164 were boys.

During the reporting period, **121** children were mainstreamed from all our BECs to the age-appropriate classes in the nearby Government school.

We also inaugurated a new Banjara Education Centre in Badri Baba Ki Dhani village during the year to support the education of more children from Banjara communities.

INFRASTRUCTURAL DEVELOPMENT

Community infrastructural support plays a key role in the overall development of communities. While people in urban cities access metros, buses, and cabs for their daily commute, Banjara communities in Rajasthan seek government support even for the basic amenities like water and electricity.

Solar Panel installation

We, as an organization, identified this core issue and are constantly

engaged in building dialogues and advocating to the local administration for their support in providing basic necessities.

Some of the infrastructural development facilitated by us during the year;

- 10 Solar lights were installed in different Banjara Communities;
- 11 Banjara Education Centres now have benches, and 9 computers were installed in our centres;
- 2 Hand pumps were installed, due to which 750 people now have access to clean drinking water;
- 2 Hand pumps were repaired in 2 communities, benefitting 700 people.

COMMUNITY HEALTH INITIATIVES

For an overall development of a community, a robust mechanism of addressing the health needs of a community is essential. Our team reached out to the Banjara communities and distributed ration kits and sensitized them on the importance of vaccinations against COVID-19, as there were many misconceptions around the vaccinations Wereached;



Vaccination against COVID-19

- 1180 Adults received vaccinations against COVID-19;
- 90 Children received their first dose of COVID-19 Vaccination (12-18 years);
- 1682 Ration kits and sanitizers were distributed to the families covering 11 villages in 5 months.

LINKAGES WITH GOVERNMENT SCHEMES

One of our significant objectives in strengthening the Banjara communities is to create linkages between the communities and the government welfare and social security schemes. During the reporting period, 1006 people, including children, were linked with Government Schemes like Palanhar Yojana, E-Shram cards, Pension schemes, etc.

WOMEN LITERACY SUPPORT

To make women independent in opening their bank accounts and other financial documents, **98 women** from **11 Banjara communities** were guided and taught to write their names by our team on the ground. We were awestruck to see the kind of happiness these women experienced in writing their names for the first time. These women are also learning to fill out forms and applications to avail the benefits of government schemes.

COMMUNITY AWARENESS & SENSITIZATION PROGRAMS

Early marriages and chores at home are key reasons for girls dropping out of school. as indicated by the National Family Health Survey-5 (2019-21). To educate and sensitize the communities to break the glass ceiling for children, specifically for girls who often are at the receiving end of orthodoxy and prejudices, we organized tailored community interventions, such as awareness campaigns, rallies and outreach programs. We used several mediums to reach the public through street plays, wall writing, rallies, fliers, and pamphlet distribution to sensitize communities on the ills of child marriage and child labour.

2500 people were reached through this campaign in the Banjara communities. The campaign aimed to spread awareness against child marriage and the prevention of school dropouts.




Campaign against Alcohol

2200 people were reached through our campaign against alcohol consumption –a prevalent practice and age–old tradition among the Banjara communities, wherein even women and children are encouraged to consume alcohol.







A Child-friendly Village refers to a village where there is equal participation of children at the panchayat level so that their voices, issues, and concerns are heard. The objective of the program is to create a robust mechanism of children's participatory model to eradicate child marriage, child sexual abuse, child labour and trafficking and any form of violence against children. It works towards preventing child exploitation such as child trafficking, child labour and child marriage right at its source along with addressing other cross-cutting issues of education, child sexual abuse, WASH and livelihood.

This year under the Bal Mitra Gram Program, we achieved:

EDUCATION

Our team conducted regular follow-ups with 245 children who were previously dropped out of schools. Post conducting a field assessment, our team on the ground re-enrolled them in schools.

To promote girls' enrolment and reduce the dropout of the girl child, **24 Cycles** were distributed to girls in our 10 BMGs which helped them commute to schools regularly.

Mini Libraries were set up in **10 schools** in our Bal Mitra Gram[™] to improve children's reading and learning outcomes. Each school was provided with **242 books**, including books on general knowledge, grammar, stories, etc. Children were overjoyed to see new storybooks and art books in their libraries.

Abhilash, a 9-year-old from BMG Kaled, shared, "I was awestruck when I saw the library in my school for the first time. I couldn't believe that so many books were kept in one place and were available for us to read for free."

Leadership through Bal Panchayat

Children from our Bal Panchayat participate in Gram Sabha and Gram Panchayat's meetings as children's representatives and to voice their concerns. As active leaders, they submitted over **65 applications** to Gram Panchayat Sarpanch, School Principals, and Local MLAs during the last year to improve the school infrastructure.

The applications demanded separate toilets for girls, accessibility to drinking water, and appointment of teachers in schools. These are the kind of issues that our children take up as they become more active in the Bal Panchayat.

Community Development Initiatives

As the COVID-19 vaccination drives kick-started for adolescents in January, our team geared up to raise awareness for vaccination against COVID-19. The team went door to door, registered the eligible children's names, and with continuous engagement with the local health administration, we successfully got 358 children vaccinated.

7520 Adults were vaccinated against COVID -19.

830 Children were also vaccinated against COVID -19

Additionally, **612** Community meetings were held during the period to discuss strategies

- · to prevent school dropouts,
- to prevent child marriages & further form linkages with government schemes.

3 Hand pumps were installed in the 10 BMGs during the reported period so that the community can regularly access clean drinking water.

We are constantly making efforts to facilitate the provision of identification documents and further creating linkages with government schemes for people belonging to marginalized communities.

Following are the highlights of the work done by Bal Mitra Gram during the year 2021-22.

- **1006** people were linked with government benefit schemes, including Mukhyamantri Chiranjivi Yojana, E-Shram Cards, Sukanya Samridhi, PM Jan Awas Yojana, MGNREGA, etc.
- **5150** people participated in Saksham Nari Sashakt Samaj Campaign on International Women's Day
- **12000** Children participated in Matdata Jagrukta Abhiyan organized in collaboration with Block Level Administration
- 2000 Trees were planted in the 10 BMGs

FOLLOW-UP ACTIVITY WITH 42 BAL MITRA GRAM'S™

Apart from our regular BMGs, we are also supporting our follow-up BMGs. The following graph reflects the data of linkages with government schemes formed during the year.


